Update: More Gateways School-Age and Youth Development Credential Level 1 modules are online!

Good News! You can complete half of the SAYD Credential Level 1 training online.

The modules available are:

- SAYD Credential Level 1 Module 1: Introduction to Child and Youth Development
- SAYD Credential Level 1 Module 2a: School Age Development (Ages 5-12)
- SAYD Credential Level 1 Module 2b: Early Adolescent Development (Ages 11-16)
- SAYD Credential Level 1 Module 2c: Late Adolescent/Young Adulthood Development (Ages 15-18)
- SAYD Credential Level 1 Module 3a: Infant/Toddler Development (Ages Birth-36 Months)
- SAYD Credential Level 1 Module 3b: Preschool Development (Ages 3-5)
- SAYD Credential Level 1 Module 4a: Health and Nutrition
- SAYD Credential Level 1 Module 4b: Safety

Not only can these trainings lead toward the SAYD Credential Level 1, but they can be used as clock hours of training for some Credential renewals and yearly professional development training requirements.

Eventually, all modules will be made available online. In the meantime, all unavailable Modules 5a, 5b, 6, 7a, 7b, 7c, 8a, 8b, and 9 must be completed face-to-face.



Be Safe Outdoors

The play yard offers an endless array of opportunities for physical exercise, discovery, creativity, and socialization.

- Enclose the outdoor space with a fence.
- Arrange large play equipment for easy supervision.
- Anchor large equipment with metal pins or concrete.
- Make sure stairs on climbing equipment have handrails the children can reach.
- Monitor the play yard every morning for debris.
- Inspect equipment daily for jagged or sharp edges, loose bolts or screws, and broken or missing parts.
- Limit sun exposure when ultraviolet rays are strongest, keep babies younger than 6 months out of direct sunlight, and apply sunscreen with parents permission.
- Have children drink water before, during, and after active play, especially in hot weather.
- Cover sandboxes overnight, and empty water from buckets and tubs.
- If storms and lightning threaten, take children inside.
 Remember the slogan: "When thunder roars, go indoors."
