Definition of Competency-Based Education (2019)

- 1. Students are **empowered** daily to make important decisions about their **learning experiences**, how they will **create and apply knowledge**, and how they will **demonstrate their learning**.
- 2. Students receive timely, differentiated support based on their individual learning needs.
- 3. Assessment is a meaningful, positive, and empowering learning experience for students that yields timely, relevant, and actionable evidence.
- 4. Students progress based on evidence of mastery, not seat time.
- 5. Students learn actively using different pathways and varied pacing.
- 6. Strategies to ensure equity for all students are embedded in the culture, structure, and pedagogy of schools and education systems.
- 7. Rigorous, common expectations for learning (knowledge, skills, and dispositions) are explicit, transparent, measurable, and transferable.



Today, our Undergraduate ECE program continues the tradition.

Credit for Prior Learning (CPL)

What is Credit for Prior Learning?

Credit for Prior Learning (CPL) is a term used to describe learning that has been gained outside of the traditional classroom or learning and knowledge that students acquired in their lives working, serving in the military, volunteering, household management/parenting, etc. In short, CPL is the evaluation and assessment of an individual's life learning for credit toward further education or training (CAEL)www.cael.org

Who is eligible for Credit for Prior Learning?

Students enrolled in the Competency-Based Bachelor of Arts in Early Childhood Education (ECE) Program and Post Bac Early Childhood Education (ECE) Program are eligible to participate in the Credit by Portfolio and Credit by Credential programs for Major Course Credit.

What are the benefits of Credit for Prior Learning for students?

Less time invested as students are given credit for their prior knowledge and experience. All field experience completed at the student's worksite.



CPL cont...

How is Credit for Prior Learning different than a course?

Credit for Prior Learning does not offer an instructor, nor does it offer content to learn and master, like a course.

Credit for Prior learning offers an assessor and opportunities to demonstrate evidence of your prior knowledge to earn credit.

Credit for Prior Learning does not have weekly mandatory due dates, like a course. ALL evidence of prior knowledge is submitted to the D2L shell before or by the last day of the term.

Credit for Prior Learning offers the opportunity for ALL field experience to be taken at the student's workplace.





Participation Requirements

- Weekly participation in synchronous Coffee Shops
- Students will have the opportunity to meet with all their CB instructors during the one-hour coffee shop.
- Students will come prepared with questions after reviewing the minilesson video posted on Mondays in the course shell by their instructors.
- The instructors will be on hand to provide students with additional support as needed.
