Welcome – Julie Lindstrom

- Attendees were welcomed to the meeting and new members Kathy Nikolai from Harper College and Jolene Taylor from National Louis were introduced.

New Applications for Competency Entitlement

- ICC Level 4 ECE
 - Committee asked that the applications be sent back as ICC needs to fill-out Levels 2 and 3 in order to be reviewed for the Level 4 ECE.
 - Not approved at this time
- Rasmussen FSC
 - Need of better assignment descriptions.
 - On the AAS document application concern over the wording “This is only for students completing the ECE leadership bachelor completter degree. Administration Specialization” placed at the bottom of Levels 2, 3 and 4. Will need clarification for the addition of this wording on the document.
 - Concern regarding discussions/assignments and how they are assessed.
 - Discussion regarding the use of courses for both for ECE and FSC and number of competencies.
 - Concern regarding observation hours not listed, in the past they have indicated that it is up to the student to submit experience hours. If they require hours they should include it in the application, no matter how they document it.
 - Recommendation: Application will be sent back to Rasmussen asking them to document/explain the observation hours, clarify the wording placed at the bottom of Level 2, 3, and 4, and how are they assessing the discussion assessments – since they are online they might have discussion rubrics etc. that should be included. Staff will contact Mary Muhs regarding the delineation of the FSC and ECE coursework and hours. Application not approved at this time.
- Concordia University ECE Level 6
 - The committee felt they met the 6 types of professional contributions and three mastery of skill areas that are needed for the Level 6.
 - Question related to course 6120 diverse learner and course 2050, should they both have been included as one is mastery level and the other undergraduate for the syllabi? Staff will follow up.
 - There was a question in their internal system section. The wording made it sound like you had to have a Concordia bachelors in order to get the Level 6/graduate degree, staff will clarify. Staff will clarify with them - they don't submit grades to INCCRRA.
