Bess Johnson, Illinois State Board of Education

- Teacher Residency Models
 - What are teacher residency programs?
 - Provide year-long clinical experiences, intensive supports from mentor teachers, and directly connect educators' pre-service experience and initial work as a teacher of record.
 - Place a teacher candidate in a classroom with a licensed teacher to learn alongside.
 - Coursework is taken in conjunction with the residency placement.
 - Benefits of a teacher residency program?
 - Gradual transition from observing to leading instruction.
 - Greater gender and racial diversity into the teaching workforce.
 - Increased teacher retention rates.

- Apprenticeship Models
 - Workforce Crisis Overview
 - Illinois has a workforce shortage, not enough individuals willing/able to work in the ECE field.
 - Within the overall workforce shortage, not enough individuals have the needed qualifications (AA, BA PEL).
 - Low compensation for those in the field.
 - Actions and Investments
 - Need substantial investment in scholarships, such as the Early Childhood Access Consortium for Equity Scholarship (ECACE).
 - Pilot innovative funding mechanisms, such as the Strengthen and Grow Child Care grants.
 - o Key components of federally registered apprenticeship
 - Employer involvement, where the employer signs on to Apprenticeship Agreement, identifies site based mentors and promotes workplace conditions that support professional learning.
 - Financial rewards for credentials and degrees, would include a contract between Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS) and employer detailing funding for wage increases based on Gateways Credentials and degrees.
 - Classroom-based instruction, where participating institutions provide instruction leading to degrees and credentials funded through existing scholarship programs.
 - Structured on the job learning, designed by participating Illinois higher education institutions supervised by mentors trained and supported by institutions of higher education.
 - Industry Recognized Credentials, Degrees and Licenses, Apprentices obtain Gateways to Opportunity Credentials, degrees and Professional Educator Licenses.
 - To address the ECE workforce crisis, Illinois would like to implement a coordinated strategy to address the specific challenges faced by the field. The Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS) Division of Early Childhood (DEC) would like to roll-out an apprenticeship model to bridge and connect scholarship programs leading to credentials and degrees with on the job training and mentorship.
 - o Pilot
 - The pilot would have a geographic balance across Illinois regions with a focus on child care sites with less access to funding.
 - Would like 4-6 institutions of higher education (both 2- and 4year) to participate.
 - 15-30 child care programs with 30-40 apprentices.
 - Child care employers would promote workplace conditions that support professional learning, identify mentors, and sponsor at least two apprentices.

- The higher education institutions would prepare apprentices for admission to ECE programs of study, assist in accessing scholarship opportunities, tutoring, and coordinate with mentors.
- Next Steps
 - Initiate IGA with intermediary
 - Develop the model
 - Launch and manage program
